

Utterance 226, §226

Faulkner: *A series of spells against snakes and other noxious creatures*

One snake is enveloped by another when is enveloped the toothless calf which came forth from the pasture. O earth, swallow up what went forth from you, O monster, lie down, crawl away. The Majesty of the Pelican has fallen into the water; O snake, turn round, for Re sees you.

Utterance 254, §278

Faulkner: *The king threatens a general cataclysm if a place is not made for him*

O Lord of the horizon, make ready a place for me, for if you fail to make ready a place for me, I will lay a curse of my father Geb, and the earth will speak no more, Geb will be unable to protect(?) himself, and whoever I find in my way, I will devour him piecemeal(?). The hnt-pelican will prophesy, the psdt-pelican will go up, the Great One will arise, the Enneads will speak, the earth being entirely dammed up; the borders will be joined together, the river-banks will unite, the roads will be impassable to travellers, the slopes will be destroyed for those who would go up.

Utterance 294, §435

Faulkner: Get back, you hidden snake; hide yourself, do not let me see you. Get back, you hidden snake; hide yourself, do not come to the place where I am, that I may not pronounce against you this your name of Nmi sone of Nmit. The Majesty of the Pelican falls into the Nile; run away, run away! O monster, lie down!

Utterance 318, §511

Faulkner: *The first T-text*

The King is a serpent who was irritated(?) and who swallowed the seven uraei and his seven neck-vertebrae came into being, who gives orders to his seven Bows and who gives orders to the monarch (sic). The Pelican⁵ is the King's mother and the King is her son.

The King has come that he may accept a finger-nail-(full) of myrrh, myrrh being on the nail.

The King has come that he may take away your power, you gods; the King turns round when he has conferred your powers.

Utterance 383, §671

Faulkner: O ttw-snake, ttw snake, where are you going? Attend on me, for I am ... your father is dead ... The Majesty of the Pelican has fallen into the Nile here. O you who are in ..., come here!

Faulkner: The Great One has fallen, the Majesty of the Pelican has fallen. O monster, lie down!
